## ostel 2 Central Wisconsin Soldiers Missing in Action in Africa

Two central Wisconsin men are reported missing in action in northwestern Africa, both apparently lost in the invasion thrust against the French colonies early in November.

They are Pfc. Clarence Arndt, 25, | son of Mr. and Mrs. William Arndt, Wisconsin Rapids, R. 5, and Pvt. Ivan G. Sadowska, 22, son of Mr. and Mrs. Gust Sadowska, Marshfield. Private Sadowska's father is a former Wood county sheriff and present deputy sheriff.

Mr. and Mrs. Arndt were notified Sunday in a telegram from the war department which stated their son had been listed missing since November 8. Clarence left with a Portage county draft quota on October 27, 1941, trained at Fort Knox, Ky., and was stationed in Ireland since last April.

His parents last heard from him in a letter he wrote October 9. He was not married and lived with his parents at their farm in the town of Grant, Portage county, before his induction into the army. A brother, Henry, resides at 240 Fourteenth street south.
