

DIED IN FRANCE

George Arnett, Serving Country on Foreign Soil, Passed to the Beyond March 15.

Mr. and Mrs. John Arnett received a message from the adjutant general at Washington Tuesday conveying the sad intelligence that their son, George, who enlisted in the Stevens Point troop of field artillery last summer to help his country in the fight for world freedom from Prussian autocracy, died from nostalgia on March 15. The sympathy of the community is with the bereaved relatives of the boy.

Death occurred in France, according to the father, who said his son arrived in that country only a few days before the date of his death. He is the first of the Marshfield soldiers in this war to die on foreign soil.

The deceased was born in Abbotsford and was 19 years of age. His parents moved to this city when he was a babe, and his home has been here since. Besides his parents, he leaves four brothers and six sisters. One of his brothers, William, is a member of Company A of this city, also in France, and he was the second oldest of the boys in this family.
