# May Chop Prices Higher This Year

## Weekend Meat Prices Higher

Most meat prices will be higher in food stores across the country this weekend. Your best bet, food men agree, will be to buy the meats chosen as special features.

The extent of price increases varies widely with different sections of the country. Sirloin steak, for instance, will be unchanged in some stores, but up four to 12 cents a pound in others. Leg of lamb may cost four to six cents a pound more. The high-flying pork chop will climb as much as 12 cents in some areas.

Meat features mentioned by a number of stores include rib roasts, various cuts of lamb, pot roast, ground beef and smoked beef tongues.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture singled out chickens as the No. 1 buy this month, despite small price increases this week.

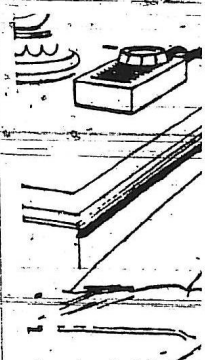
