Body of Sgt. B. V. Buehler Reaches U. S.

Remains of S/Sgt. Bernard V. Buehler, son of Mrs. John Buehler, Sr., Nekoosa, who was killed in action October 13, 1944 in Italy, have been returned to the United States aboard the army funeral transport, "Carroll Victory."

The body is to be brought to Nekoosa for final interment.

Sgt. Buehler went overseas in June, 1944, and was on his thirty-first mission on a Liberator bomber when he met his death. Previously he had been awarded the Air medal and Oak Leaf cluster.

Born in Nekoosa on July 28, 1912, he was a graduate of Alexander High school, and attended the University of Wisconsin and Central State Teachers college. On February 5, 1942 he married Miss Catherine Feldner at Nekoosa, and in October of that year he enlisted in the army air corps.

After training as an airplane mechanic at Keesler field, Miss., Sgt. Buehler was transferred to Laredo, Tex., and received the silver wings of a gunner. He then took advanced training as an aeronautical engineer at Briggs field, El Paso, Tex., prior to being assigned to overseas duty.
