

MASS FOR SGT. BUEHLER MONDAY

A military requiem high mass with obseques will be said Monday at 8:15 a. m., at Sacred Heart church, Nekoosa, by the Rev. Alvin Daul for S/Sgt. Bernard V. Buehler, son of Mrs. John Buehler sr., of Nekoosa, who was killed in action October 13 in Italy.

Sergeant Buehler was on his 31st mission on a Liberator bomber when he met his death. He had received the Oak Leaf Cluster and the Air Medal since going overseas in June, 1944.

The Nekoosa flier was born in that town on July 28, 1912. Following his graduation from Alexander high school, he attended the University of Wisconsin and Central State Teachers' college. Before entering civil service as an engineer, he was employed by Nekoosa-Edwards Paper Co.

Sergeant Buehler and the former Catherine Feldner were married on February 5, 1942 at Nekoosa. He enlisted in the service at Fort Snelling, October 7, 1942. Training as an airplane mechanic at Keesler field, Miss., he was transferred to Laredo, Tex., and received the silver wings of a gunner. He received advanced training as an aeronautical engineer at Briggs field, El Paso, Tex., and was assigned overseas duty.

In addition to his wife and mother, he is survived by eight brothers and sisters, namely, August Buehler, Port Edwards; John B. Buehler, Los Angeles, Calif.; Mrs. Josephine Buchanan and Miss Ann Buehler, Nekoosa; Mrs. Mary Peck, Milwaukee; Pvt. Louis Buehler, with the postal service in France; Mrs. Victoria Larson, Nekoosa, and Mrs. Sara Buchanan, Wisconsin Rapids.
