FORMER LOCAL FLIER KILLED

Friends were informed Monday of the death, in a plane crash in New Mexico, of Lt. Harold H. (Shurly) Burwell, 33, formerly of Wisconsin Rapids, and stationed recently at Fort Sumner, N. M., with the army airforce.

Details Not Learned

Details of the accident were unknown here. Lieutenant Burwell was not among victims listed in connection with a crash in New Mexico, wreckage of which was found Saturday. His fate became known Saturday, the widow said in a telegram to friends here.

The flier had been missing for a week, having set out on a flight from Albuquerque to Phoenix on October 10.

Spent 2 Years Here

Member of a prominent Fort Lauderdale, Fla., family, Lieutenant Burwell had spent about two years in Wisconsin Rapids before joining the army's ferry command last spring. He was employed at the Tri-City airport here, and worked for a time at Hotel Witter.

He was transferred to the army airforce last March, and came here late that month. During his stay here he was married to Maxine Sarnoff, Wisconsin Rapids.

She survives with his parents, of Fort Lauderdale, and a brother, John, member of the Florida legislature.
