II Milladore Soldier Killed In Action in Italy Sector

Parents Receive Word Death of Pfc. John C. Crabb, 23

(By News-Herald Correspondent)

Milladore-Mr. and Mrs. Philip Crabb of Milladore have been informed by the Secretary of War that their son, Pfc. John Carl Crabb, 23, one of three in service, was killed in action in Italy Jan. 30.

He had been sent overseas Oct. 2, 1943, landing in North Africa, and had been at Oran, Casablanca, and Alexandria before being sent to Italy.

John was born Feb. 26, 1920, in Altdorf. He left for military training Feb. 24, 1943, and from Fort Sheridan, Ill., was sent to Camp Roberts, Calif. After several months of schooling as a mechanic, he was sent to Fort Ben-

ning, Ga. He came home on Sept. 20 for a furlough, and then went to Fort Meade, Md., where he stayed but a short time before going over-

Surviving besides his parents, seas. who live on a farm, 3 miles northeast of Milladore, are six brohers, Pvt. Edward Crabb, England; Norbert Crabb, Camp Gordon, Johnston, Fla.; Matthew Crabb, Cross Plains; Lawrence Crabb, Wisconsin Rapids; and Martin and Joseph Crabb, at home.
