MILWAUKEEAN CHARGED WITH HAVING TWO WIVES

Milwaukee — (P) — Harry J. Brost, 52, was arrested yesterday on a district attorney's warrant that charged Brost had maintained two homes and two wives within a few blocks of each other for several months. The warrant alleges that Brost, under his own name, married a Milwaukee woman on Oct. 16, 1928 and that as Harry J. Mueller, he married another Milwaukee woman July 3, 1942, and that he has maintained both homes.

Detective John Zilavy said a search of police records disclosed that Brost had been charged with the abandonment of another wife and two children in 1924, but that the first Mrs. Brost divorced him.

Bloc Opposes Increase
Members of a Senate bloc opposed to increasing the armed forces to 10,800,000 this year on the ground it would absorb needed farm and industrial manpower, disclosed plans to submit a resolution directing the Appropriations Committee to refuse funds for Army enlargement.

The measure, authored by Senators Bankhead (D-Ala), Nye (R-ND) and Thomas (D-Okla), would compel cutting the Army's projected size of 8,200,000 by approximately 2,000,000.

- Other manpower developments:
1. An assertion by Secretary of War Stimson that foes of Army expansion are trying to avoid "inconveniences and relatively minor sacrifices."
 2. A Senate battle over the type of legislation desired to defer farm workers from military service.
 3. An effort by Senator Wheeler (D-Mont) to attach a rider to the farm deferment legislation eliminating induction of fath over 38.

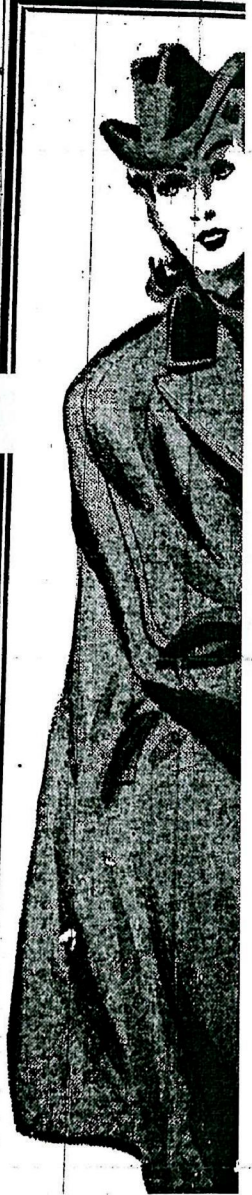
