Greece's military government expressed "deep sorrow" over the shooting, and Premier George Papadopoulos cabled the senator the government's wishes for a speedy recovery.

## Stab Wounds Claim Vesper Serviceman

The U.S. Navy said today a sailor from the carrier Bon Homme Richard was stabbed to death in a night club incident at Olongapo City, north west Philippines, was a native of Vesper, Wis.

The victim, James Iwanski, 22, and a woman companion were stabbed to death three days ago by a youth identified as a cashier of the club. Olongapo police said jealousy was the motive.

The city adjoins the big U. S. Naval Base at Subic Bay.

The slain serviceman's parents are Mr. and Mrs. Stanley Iwanski of Vesper.

The body of their son will be brought to the Taylor Funeral Home in Wisconsin Rapids, where funeral arrangements are pending.

Iwanski enlisted in the Navy on July 29, 1964, and had served in Vietnam on three occasions.

He was born July 10, 1945, at Wausau, and graduated from Pittsville High School in 1964. He held membership in St. James Catholic Church in Vesper.

Surviving, in addition to his parents, are four brothers, Gerald, Roger, Robert and Thomas, all at home; four sisters, Mrs. Richard Horswill and Janet Iwanski, both of Milwaukee, and Marilyn and Mary Lou, both at home; and his maternal grandfather, Telesfor Chojnowski, Michigan City, Ind. One sister preceded him in death.
