Frederick Krug

ALTDORF — Frederick Krug, 46, was pronounced dead on arrival at Riverview Hospital in Wisconsin Rapids at 2:45 p.m. Saturday. He had been ill the past 13 years.

Funeral services will be held Wednesday at 10 a.m. in St. Joseph's Catholic Church, Alt Dorf, the Rev. Jerome Gerum officiating. Burial is to follow in the parish cemetery.

The son of Mr. and Mrs. John Krug was born in Byran, Germany, Dec. 29, 1913, coming to this vicinity with his parents in 1926. He had been operating the family farm here.

During World War II Mr. Krug served in France with the 4th Armored Division.

He married the former Elizabeth Schudy in Sigel on June 21, 1947. She survives.

Also surviving are four children, John, Jerome, Fred Jr., and Ronald, all at home; his mother, Mrs. John Krug, Alt Dorf; four brothers, Michael and Carl, Rt. 4, Wisconsin Rapids; George, Rt. 1, Vesper, and Andrew, Milwaukee, and two sisters, Sister M. Rita Rose, School Sisters of Notre Dame, Wisconsin Rapids, and Mrs. Walter Peopke, Pewaukee. His father preceded him in death.
