Ronald C. Huser



LOVELAND, Colo. — Ronald C. Huser, 59, of Loveland, Colo., died Tuesday, April 25, 2006, at Poudre Valley Hospital in Fort Collins, Colo., after a brief illness.

A Mass of Christian burial was held May 1, 2006, at St. John's Catholic Church in Loveland. Inurnment of remains was held in Loveland Burial Park with full military honors conducted by the Associated Veterans Club of Loveland.

Ron was born April 24, 1947, in Marshfield, the son of Joseph Nicholas and Theora Petrine (Gall) Huser. He was drafted into the U.S. Army on Sept. 14, 1966, and served as a medical corpsman assigned to HHC 3d BN, 503 INF, 173 Airborne Brigade. He was awarded the Purple Heart Medal, National Defense Medal, Vietnam Service Medal, Vietnam Campaign Medal, Combat Medical Badge and unit citations.

He was married to Barbara Neitz on Dec. 5, 1970, in Northglenn, Colo. The couple

moved to Arpin where they owned and operated a dairy farm. They relocated to Loveland in 1988. Mr. Huser was employed as the nursery supervisor for the Colorado State Forestry Service at Colorado State University.

He is survived by his wife, Barbara S., Loveland; two sons, Eric Michel (Mandi), Thornton, Colo., and Joseph William, San Francisco; two daughters, Danna Marie (Randy Herman) Huser, Loveland, and Sue Ann (Audie) Vigil, Henderson, Colo.; and three grandchildren.
