# One Wood Co. Man Missing, Another Dead

Marshfield, Wis.—Another Marshfield soldier has been reported missing in action in the southwestern Pacific area and one previously reported missing is now listed as dead.

Mr. and Mrs. Peter Rottscheit were informed by a war department telegram that their son, Pfc. Arnold G. Rottscheit, 20, has been missing since December 6. He was known to have been in New Guinea with an artillery unit and has been in service since National Guardsmen were inducted in 1940. His parents last heard from him in a letter written November 28.

A telegram to Mr. and Mrs. G. W. Hoag, said their son, Sgt. Walter E. Hoag, previously reported missing since November 19 is now listed as dead. He also was in New Guinea.

The Marshfield casualty list now shows five men killed and one missing, besides several wounded.
