Marshfield, Wis.—Telegrams from the war department to relatives here today added another death in action, another soldier wounded and a soldier seriously ill with malaria in the southwest Pacific to casualties of this city.

Mr. and Mrs. Peter Rottschoit were informed that their son, Pfc. Arnold J. was killed in action in New Guinea on December 13. He had previously been reported missing. His death brought to seven the number from Marshfield killed in the campaign.

S/Sgt. Eldor Siemers is the malaria victim. His wife and mother live here. Sgt. Mike Soloski was wounded in New Guinea December 30. His wife and 7-months-old child are in Marshfield and his parents are Mr. and Mrs. Nick Soloski.
