Arrangements were completed this morning for funeral services to be held Wednesday at 8:30 p. m. at the Krohn and Berard chapel for Lieut. Commander Thomas Uttegaard, 50, who died Friday morning at the Navy hospital in Brooklyn, N. Y. The body arrived last evening and was taken under military escort to the funeral home.

Funeral services will be in charge of Charles Hagerstrom Post No. 3, American Legion, of which Commander Uttegaard was a member. The body will be taken to Milwaukee on Thursday for cremation.

Commander Uttegaard was born in Eau Claire on December 9, 1893, the son of Ole T. and Ragna (Brekken) Uttegaard. He married Isabel E. Fletcher at Columbia, S. C., on May 31, 1918, and they came to this city 23 years ago.

Besides his wife he leaves three sons, Thomas F. at Annapolis, John H. in the marine corps at San Diego, Calif., and Rolf at home, and four brothers, Olin in the navy, Arthur and Olaf of Detroit and Harold of Eau Claire.
