**Described in Detail**  
In general, it recounted the shocking story of calculated and degradation made famous by scores of articles from the past.

In detailing in detail on the establishment at Buchenwald, the law officer said:

The pictures and descriptions of the conditions at this camp cannot adequately portray what we saw and it is only when the atmosphere of the camp is smelled that one can have a complete appreciation of the depths of degradation to which the German Nazi government and those responsible had dropped in their treatment of those who have failed to live the doctrines of the Aryan race."

The macabre detail of the Dachau camp was related. There "prisoners of distinction," including those with military records, were made to kneel on a small plank as they were executed by machine gun fire. Women and common criminals knelt on an open bank to receive their bullets.

Since we had seen no coffins at the other camps visited, we inquired why coffins were used at Dachau, and were informed that the coffins were reserved for prisoners of distinction."

The committee visited Dachau in 48 hours after its liberation by American forces.

**Justice Will Emerge**  
When we arrived there were many prisoners lying dead between the inner and outer barbed fences," the legislators said, "apparently shot by the guards."

## LOCAL MAN LEARNS SON DIED ON LUZON

### T/Sgt. Robert Vogler Is Reported Killed in Philippine Battle

Sergeant Vogler entered the service 38 months ago at Beaver Dam and spent 31 months in the Southwest Pacific. He was a veteran of fighting on Guadalcanal, New Georgia, the Hebrides and New Guinea. His mother died 10 years ago.

**Denies Report**

**In Belgrade, Edvard Kardelj, second vice-president of the Yugoslav Government, said "certain foreigners are repeating a slander to the effect that Yugoslavia in occupying this territory wishes to place before the world a fait accompli."**

"These allegations have no foundations whatsoever," Kardelj said. "These calumnies are inspired by the same imagination which in the past accused the Yugoslav Army of committing cruelties upon the Trieste (Trieste) inhabitants. Yugoslavia has never refused to confer and express its requests as concerns frontiers at the peace conference."

Kardelj said the Yugoslav Army had "liberated the Slovene Littoral, Istria, and Trieste at the cost of many lives." He added, however, that "the Yugoslavs cannot be denied the right to organize a military occupation authority in order to assure law and order until the problem of fixing frontiers is solved by direct agreement between Italy and Yugoslavia."

**Serious Turn**

The British spokesman issued his statement after the publication of stories in London newspapers suggesting affairs might take a serious turn.

The London Daily Mail said Britain and the United States formally had asked Tito to withdraw all forces from the Adriatic port and the rest of Istria. The Daily Herald reported a British cruiser and two destroyers had arrived there.

The Italian Government of Premier Ivanoe Bonomi has hinted it is ready to resign if Trieste remains under Yugoslav control, the Herald said. Trieste had been awarded to Italy after World War I.
