# PFC. WATERMAN DIES ON OKINAWA

Pfc. Sidney C. Waterman, 26, whose wife, Bernice, resides at 230 Seventeenth avenue north, was killed in action April 29, on Okinawa, according to a war department telegram received by the soldier's wife.

Private Waterman was an infantryman, with the 96th infantry division.

He was born September 18, 1918 at Harrison, Ark. He attended the Vesper Graded school and was graduated from Plainfield High school with the class of 1936.

Prior to his entry into the armed forces July 21, 1944, he was employed at the Massey Harris company of Racine. He received training at Camp Wolters, Tex., and went overseas last January.

In addition to his wife, Private Waterman is survived by two small children, Patricia and Paul; his parents, Mr. and Mrs. O. W. Waterman, Plainfield; two sisters, Mrs. Herbert Rhein, Wisconsin Rapids, and Mrs. Leonard Klubertanz, Milwaukee, and one brother, Carl, of Milwaukee.

Memorial services will be held Sunday afternoon, June 10, at the First Baptist church of Plainfield.
