## Seek Facts in Witte Death

As a result of various reports that T/4 Conrad Witte, 40, Wisconsin Rapids, might have met death Sunday at Camp Adair, Ore., through foul play, the Daily Tribune today endeavored to establish how he suffered a compound skull fracture. An inquiry through the Associated Press to Camp Adair revealed only that Sergeant Witte had died of a skull fracture and that the army is investigating the case. The public relations officer said it was unknown when a decision would be available and that no details could be released at this time, suggesting that next of kin be contacted for information.

Mrs. Witte flew to Oregon upon news of her husband's injury but he is believed to have died before she reached his bedside. Members of the immediate family here said that no word has been received to the effect that Witte had been found in the barracks badly hurt and robbed as rumored. The Baker Mortuary, which will have charge of funeral arrangements when the body arrives here, presumably Friday, said it had no other information other than that published in the Tribune yesterday.
