Application for permission to write the civil service examinations should be submitted to Congressman Murray, 423 House Office building, Washington 25, D. C., before June 20, 1946.

Annapolis naval academy candidates must not be less than 17 years or more than 21 years of age on April 1 of the calendar year in which they enter.

Boys who are serving in the armed forces, whether stationed in this country or overseas, may also write the examination.
