### Soldiers Will Remain For Indefinite Period

Washington — (AP) — Soldiers sent to the Southwest and South Pacific probably face a tour of duty of indefinite duration in those areas, the war department has advised Representative Edith Nourse Rogers (R-Mass.).

However, soldiers are likely to be given home leaves after 18 months of "hazardous duty abroad on an outlying station," Navy Secretary Knox told the Massachusetts congressman, who in turn placed the information in the Congressional Record.

Mr. Rogers wrote Secretary of War Stimson and Knox stating that eight mothers from Winchester, Mass., had asked that their sons be granted furloughs to return home from the South Pacific where they had been stationed the past 21 months.

"This is promulgated as a matter of policy and not of directive since the granting of leave or rotation must be consistent with the maintenance of the fighting efficiency of the service," he said. "The granting of leave remains the prerogative of the commanding officer."

John W. Martin, administrative assistant in the war department, replied that while the matter of providing a definite time limit for service overseas has been studied continuously since Pearl Harbor, there is one insurmountable obstacle — insufficient shipping facilities.

The present war department policy places upon the overseas commander the determination as to when an individual should be returned to the United States, Mr. Martin said.

Primary emphasis is placed upon rotating personnel from station to station within the theater in order to provide relief for those on duty at remote and small stations as well as for those serving in severe climatic conditions.

Shipping conditions in the Southwest Pacific area are such that there will probably be no rotation of units to the United States for the rotation policy for an indefinite period. It added that the same situation applied in the South Pacific area.

Navy Has Policy Of Rotating Personnel  
Knox wrote that the navy department has announced its policy of rotating enlisted personnel for rehabilitation leave and reassignment after a minimum period of 18 months in hazardous duty, or in outlying stations, he said.

### Tire Shortage Will Continue, Says Dewey

#### Recaps Are More Plentiful

Washington — (AP) — Rubber Director Bradley Dewey warned today that the next six to nine months would bring the most critical tire shortage of the war, and told "A" and "B" gasoline card holders to cut their driving to "bare necessity" because they would not get any new tires "in the visible future."

In a survey of the rubber situation, Dewey sounded the most serious note since the 1942 Baruch report. He said synthetic production was going according to schedule, but that facilities for producing tires and rayon and cotton tire cords were still far from complete.

He said military requirements are tremendous; production of one large bomber tire alone cancels out the ability to produce up to 30 passenger car tires.
