"I fought in World War II for these rights," Burns said in his objection to an order that sideburns not extend below the earlobe. "My wife likes my sideburns, I like them and so do my kids," he said. The firefighter trimmed his sideburns Sunday after Deputy Chief Harland Lippolt declared he would be guilty of insubordination if he didn't. "I decided to cut now and fight later," Burns said.

### Ann Landers Answers Your Questions

**Panics When Near Window**  
Dear Ann Landers: I've made some mistakes in my life but as I look back over the past 34 years I see many tragedies over which I had no control. Both my parents were drowned when I was 16. My brother whom I adored was burned to death in a fire. A sister I envied and disliked died in a car accident. To this day I feel as if I murdered her because I was driving. You may not be able to help me, Ann, but perhaps just expressing my feelings in writing will make me feel better. I am haunted by the fear that I will commit suicide. There are times when I hate living and want to die, but I know suicide is the coward's way out. More important, I have three wonderful children who need a mother. Their father is away a great deal and I'm afraid he has no real interest in his family. I am terrified that I will jump out of a window. Whenever I'm near a large open window I panic. I am so afraid of elevators, I'd rather walk up 10 flights than go into one. Can you give me a few sentences of hope? What can I do to get over these hellish feelings? — Gwendolyn

Dear Dwendolyn: I almost never recommend books but I'm going to make an exception because I've just read a book that could help save your life. It is called "The Prison of My Mind," by Barbara Field Benziger. The publisher is Walker. If your bookstore doesn't have it, ask them to get it. This book is a moving personal account of a courageous woman who conquered mental illness. Her honesty and openness will give encouragement and hope to every person who fears he is cracking up. The best answer for one who is suicidal is a therapist in whom he has confidence. The author of "Prison of My Mind" emphasizes this point. While Mrs. Benziger credits therapy with saving her life she makes it abundantly clear that not all psychiatrists are humane, kind and competent.

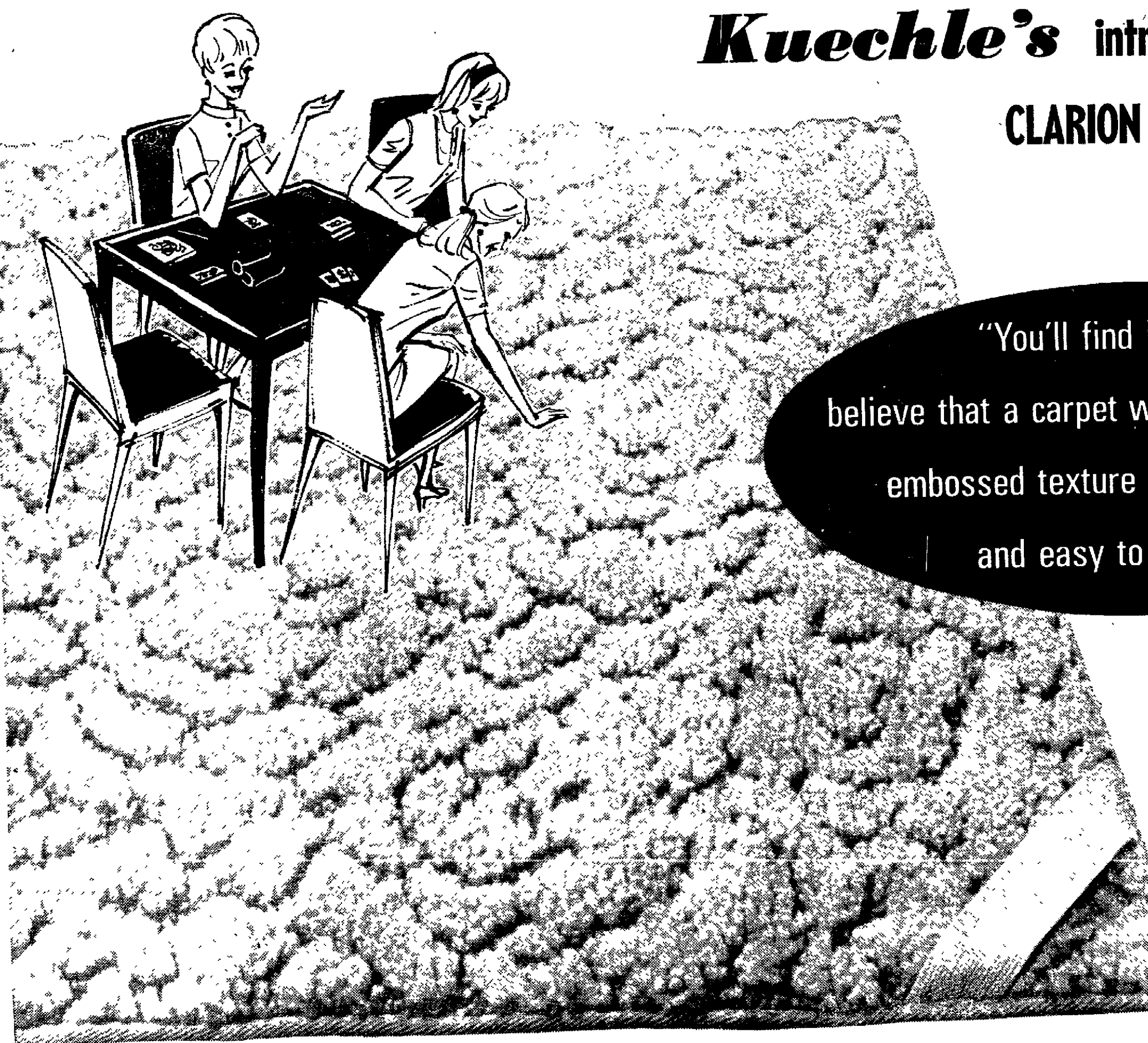
