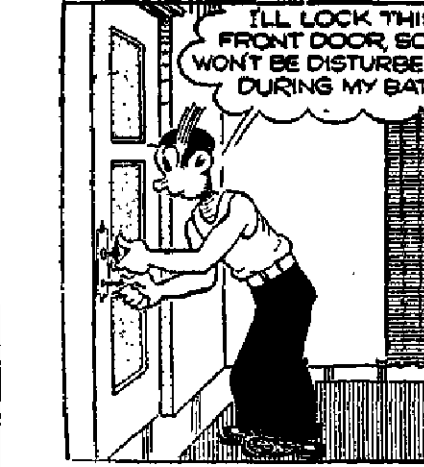

Stocks Make Mixed Show Near Day's End

New York—(AP)—Selected stocks contested the lower trend in today's market although some leaders continued under mild pressure.

After early irregularity several issues attempted to recover but declined fractionally and after erasing some of the losses had a mixed appearance near the close. Dealings approximated 1,200,000 shares.

Unconditional capitulation of German forces in Italy failed to make a dent in market operations, which remained clam throughout the day. President Truman's statement on the surrender revived a feeling in Wall street that V-E day is still nearer.

Chicago—(AP)—Rye jumped 2 1/2 cents at the opening of grain futures markets today but after the early flurry the trade quieted and most prices moved irregularly within fractions of yesterday's final quotations.

Many speculators took advantage of the minor upturns and frequent periods of easiness, trimming accounts and awaiting further developments in Europe.

Receipts were: Wheat 22 cars, corn 191, oats 8, soybeans 1 1/2. At the finish wheat was 1/2 to 1/4 lower than yesterday's close, May \$1.73 1/2. Corn was up 1/4 to off 1/4, May \$1.14 1/2. Oats were 1/4 higher to 1/4 lower, May 66 1/4-14. Rye was up 1/4 to off 1/4, May \$1.34 1/2-1.35. Barley was down 1/4 to 1/2, May 96 1/2.
