

Army Airman, Formerly of Arpin, Killed in Australia

Capt. Glenwood G. Stephenson, 27, of the army air corps, son of Mr. and Mrs. Gordon B. Stephenson, Milwaukee, formerly of the town of Arpin, was killed in Australia, his parents were notified today.

Captain Stephenson, who resided in Wood county from 1927 to 1935, went to the Philippines in November, 1941, serving under General MacArthur in the defense of the islands, and also flew a bomber in the battles for the Dutch East Indies. He escaped the Japanese and flew with his squadron to Australia. No word had been received from him since last November 25 and the message to his parents did not tell how he was killed.

The air corps captain was grad-

uated from the Auburndale high school in 1932 and from the Wood County Normal school, after which he enlisted in the army and was sent to the Philippines. While there he received his appointment to West Point military academy, graduating in 1940. He then took air corps training at Tuscaloosa and Montgomery, Ala., and Savannah, Ga., where he finished as a senior bomber pilot.

Stephenson was promoted to the rank of captain early this year. On October 3, 1941, he was married to Ann Grace Nail at Savannah.

Surviving besides the widow and parents are three brothers, Clyde, a marine at Hawaii; Roland, a student at the University of Wisconsin, and Stuart, of Milwaukee.
