# Toll Almost in Half

Chicago-(AP) - The United States cut its traffic death toll during the first six months of 1943 to almost half of its pre-war figure, the National Safety council reported today.

The half-year drop was 41 per cent from the same period in 1911 and 32 per cent from that in 1942. This year's traffic deaths through June totaled 10,030, compared with 17,028 in the first half of 1941 and 14,690 in the first balf of 1942. Wartime restrictions on speed


and mileage were credited for most

For June alone the traffic toll the largest percentage reduction so far in the war period. It was 24 per cent below June, 1942. Traffic deaths last month totaled 1,610, against 3,114 in June, 1941.
