

The interest on some federal government bonds or other federal government obligations is also exempt from taxation, though it also must be reported on schedule A. The tax exemption status of obligations of the government issued before March 1, 1941, depends on the provision of the Act of Congress under which the obligation was issued. The various types of fully and partially tax-exempt bonds have been classified on lines (b) through (h) of schedule A. You should list obligations which you own on the appropriate line.

Pay On War Bonds
