

BODIES OF DECEASED SOLDIERS

May be Shipped Home at the Expense of the Government.

The remains of deceased soldiers who were buried in Ponce will be enclosed in coffins and transported to the nearest national cemetery at the expense of the government, or if so desired by their relatives, to their homes for burial. The cost of expense of burial other than cost of transportation will be limited to \$35. Undertaker Harry Boston, of Stevens Point, has been delegated to bring back the remains of Private Theo. Bronson of Co. A to his home in Stevens Point. C. E. Blodgett received a letter from Mr. Boston on Tuesday in which he offers to attend to the removal of the remains of any of the other members of Co. A whose bodies are still in the cemetery at Ponce. The father of Corporal John L. Davis, is negotiating with Mr. Boston for the removal of his son to his home in Richfield.
