

Local Mother Lost Son in War, Has Four More Still in Service

Mrs. Carl Fehrenbach, 410 W. Seventh street, has known the bitterness of losing a son in service, but she also looks forward to the joy of greeting four other sons when they doff their Army uniforms and come home to her again. All of her five sons have served in Uncle Sam's Army during World War II.

One, First Lt. Donald Fehrenbach, 25, is now presumed dead by the War Department, having been

missing in action in Germany since Sept. 26, 1944, when the B-17 in which he was a bombardier was shot down.

Sgt. James J. Fehrenbach, 28, a member of the U. S. Marine Corps, is temporarily stationed on the Island of Guam. He left the States Aug. 21, 1945, and has been in service since April 20, 1942.

Sgt. William C. Fehrenbach, 23, of the U. S. Marine Corps, at present is stationed at El Toro, Calif., at the Marine Corps Air Station's aerological office. He returned to the States from the Pacific, after 20 months of overseas duty, on Jan. 2, 1945, and has been in service since Nov. 20, 1942.

Sgt. Norman Fehrenbach, 21, who has been overseas 17 months, is at the Army Air Forces weather station at Hickham Field, Hawaii. He has been in service since Jan. 21, 1943.

Pvt. Robert J. Fehrenbach, 19, with the Army Air Forces at Fort Worth Army Air Field, Fort Worth, Texas, is now home on furlough. He enlisted for aviation cadet training Jan. 20, 1944, and was called into service March 15, 1945. His basic training was taken at Sheppard Field, Tex. An eighth grade graduate of Sacred Heart Parochial School, he was graduated from Marshfield Senior High School in 1944.
