Legion Ceremonies Cites War Vets

Two U.S. casualties of the Korean and Vietnamese wars were honored by the American Legion here Sunday in rededication ceremonies.

Plaques were presented to Mrs. Agnes Kesler, mother of Sgt. Vernon L. Kesler, who was killed in the Korean conflict, and Mr. and Mrs. Wilford Martin, parents of Pfc. Vernal G. Martin, who died in Vietnam.

Mayor Raymond Tippelt read an of-

ficial proclamation renaming the post, which now becomes the Lesselyong-Sadowska-Kesler-Martin American Legion Post 54.

Jim Reiningger of Sun Prairie, the state historian for the Wisconsin American Legion, paid homage to the veterans of all wars and cited the Preamble to the Constitution of the American Legion that states "to preserve the memories and incidents of our associations in great wars."

Reiningger told the 150 people who attended the ceremony that the American Legion advocates a national defense strong enough to keep America free. He said that anything less would be a dishonor to be veterans who gave their lives to defend and maintain U.S. freedom.
