Pfc. Lee F. McAllister, 24, son of Frank McAllister, 1931 Sixth street south, died February 3 in Germany of wounds received in action, according to a telegram received from the war department today.

Private McAllister was serving with the 302nd infantry, 94th division. His last letter home was dated January 11.

He was born November 13, 1920, at Hancock, and attended high school in Wisconsin Rapids. Before entering service November 18, 1942, he was employed at Rued's Service center.

The Wisconsin Rapids soldier received training at Camp Phillips, Kan., and Camp McCain, Miss., before going overseas to England in August, 1944. After three weeks in England, he was transferred to the mainland of Europe.

He is survived by his father, a sister, Mrs. Warren Hamilton, Wisconsin Rapids, and one brother, Ray McAllister, Arpin.
