Weather Instrument

Box Lands on Farm

A government weather bureau instrument box, sent aloft by balloon at St. Cloud, Minn., and carried to earth by parachute was found by Donald Springer while plowing on the farm of his father O. M. Springer, about mid-afternoon Tuesday. The farm is located five miles northwest of Wisconsin Rapids in the town of Sigel.

It is speculated that the box was released from a weather balloon spotted west of the city earlier the same afternoon.

An explanation on the box stated that it had been sent up via balloon which carried it to a height of about 12 miles. When automatically released, the instrument came down slowly on a parachute. While in the air, the instrument, complete with a small an-
