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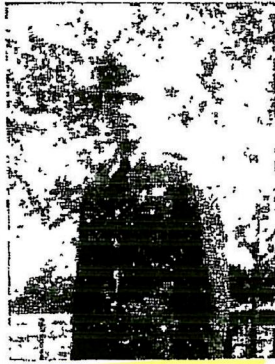
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ARPIN SOLDIER DIES IN ACTION

Pfc. George H. Pick Jr., 26, son of Mr. and Mrs. George Pick, Route 1, Arpin, died in action on New Guinea, according to a war department telegram received by his parents earlier this week.

He had made four combat jumps and the last letter which his parents received was written August 30 and stated that he was in a replacement center, waiting to be transferred to the United States.

Private Pick was born on January 17, 1918 near Chilton, and received his grade schooling at Manitowoc. He attended high school at Chilton for one year and then was graduated from Pittsville high school in 1938.

He entered the armed forces on October 16, 1942, at Fort Sheridan, Ill. Later, he was transferred to Camp Wolters, Tex., and then to Fort Benning, Ga., for training with the paratroopers. After a short furlough in May, 1943, he was sent to Fort Bragg, N. C. Private Pick returned home on another furlough the latter part of September, 1943, before going overseas.

In addition to his parents, Private Pick is survived by his wife Edna, who is living in Australia, where they were married on March 16, 1944, and a brother, Henry.



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
