# Former Rapids Man Is Killed In Philippines

Pfc. Albert J. Quimby, 30, a former resident of Wisconsin Rapids, was killed in action May 7, on Luzon Island in the Philippines, according to the war department. He was a member of a medical detachment.

Private Quimby was born in Rhinelander January 21, 1915. He lived in Wisconsin Rapids from 1930 to 1944, when he entered military service in July. At that time his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Mitchell Quimby, moved to Los Angeles, Calif.

Prior to entering the army, Private Quimby was employed by the Nekoosa Edwards Paper company. He received his training at Camp Roberts, Calif.

In addition to his parents, Private Quimby is survived by his wife, Joyce, and daughter, Deanna, two brothers, Sgt. Leonard Quimby, in the Pacific and Russell at Los Angeles; and four sisters, Dorothy Applebee, Third street south, Wisconsin Rapids, Mrs. Hattie Seovill, Virginia and Gladys, at Los Angeles.
