Julius Rude Jr. Dies in Country's Service; War's First Fatality from Here

Julius Rude jr., 20, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. A. Rude, Route 1, is Wisconsin Rapids' first fatality of

His parents received a telegram Sunday from the U. S. navy de-partment in Washington announc-ing that he lost his life on Febru-ary 18, "in the performance of his duty and in the service of his coun-try."

Enlisted Year Ago
Julius, best known to his friends here as Junior, enlisted in the navy January 29, 1941. He was a fireman, third class, aboard a destroyer of the Atlantic fleet, and the last letter his parents received from him had been mailed from Boston. It is had been mailed from Boston. It is considered likely that his ship was engaged in convoy duty in the Atlantic.

"The navy department exceeding-In a navy acparament exceeding-ly regrets to advise you that your son, Julius Rude, fireman third class, U. S. army, lost his life on February 18, 1942, in the perform-ance of his duty and in the service of his country.
"Further details will be communi-

"Further details will be communicated to you by his communding officer. Should body be recovered you will be notified immediately. Sincere sympathy is extended to you in this deep sorrow."

Julius Rude jr. was born in Wisconsin Rapids November 1, 1921 and was educated in the local schools, spending his entire life in this community until his enlistment in the navy little more than a year ago. He was a graduate of Lincoln high school with the class of 1940.
