TE FINANCE P DISCUSSES TAX BILL

Stanton—Senator Vandenberg declared today the new tax bill increases taxes somewhat for persons with one or more children and see how you can justify 944 taxes on anybody—is absolutely indispensable legislation.”

Vandenberg's comment was at the opening of the senate finance committee on the unanimously approved measure. Committee members generally indicated approval of the bill.
