Funeral services will be held at 2 o'clock Monday afternoon at the First Congregational Church in Nekoosa for Pfc. John R. Wulf, 23,

The Rev. H. C. Kuhnert is to officiate. Interment will take place in Riverside Cemetery with military rites by Schuman-Arendt post No. 5860, Veterans of Foreign Wars, and Hamel-Ruder post No. 381, American Legion.

Pfc. Wulf entered the Army on Jan. 8, 1951, and received his training at Camp Polk, La. He went overseas in June, 1951, and was stationed in Japan until December when he went to Korea with the 45th Infantry Division.

He was born at Bottineau, N. D., on Sept. 17, 1928, the son of Mr. and Mrs. John W. Wulf. He came to this area in 1947 and resided with his uncle and aunt, Mr. and Mrs. Moses Griffen, Port Edwards, prior to his marriage to Violet Schauer on Sept. 3, 1950. Before entering the service he was employed by the Nekoosa-Edwards Paper Co.

Survivors include his wife and I0-month-old daughter Marion, Wisconsin Rapids; his father, John W. Wulf, Warm Springs, Ore; his mother, Mrs. Thelma Torrington, Hutchinson, Kan.; four brothers, William, Nekoosa; James, Port Edwards; Elmer and Bruce, Warm Springs, Ore; one sister Miss Barbara Wulf, Port Edwards and his grandmother, Mrs. Matilda Jones, Willow City, N. D.
