Dean Davis Dies At Wood Hospital

Dean E. Davis, 36, 2320 Gaynor avenue, a veteran of World war II, died Monday night at the Veterans' hospital at Wood, where he had been a patient for two weeks. His health had been poor for the past year.

Funeral arrangements, which are in charge of the Baker Mortuary, have not been completed, however, friends may pay their respects at the mortuary after 6 p. m. Wednesday.

Mr. Davis was born at New Rome, Adams county, on July 19, 1915, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Earl Davis, and graduated from Lincoln High school in 1935. He married Betty Sherwood at Dubuque, Ia., on November 9, 1940, and they took up residence here.

On August 17, 1942, he entered the army and served in Europe, North Africa and Sicily, receiving his discharge on January 29, 1944. prior to his illness he was employed by the Kraft Foods company at the warehouse on Gaynor avenue.

Surviving are his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Earl Davis; his wife; two sons, Larry and Dennis; one daughter, Dawn; two brothers, Edwin and Russell, and two sisters, Mrs. Revae Frost and Marian Davis, all of Wisconsin Rapids.
