

Military Rites for Flight Officer Giese

The body of Flight Officer Frank H. Giese was interred with military honors this afternoon following services at the Methodist church at 2 o'clock.

The church was filled to capacity for the rites at which the Rev. A. W. Triggs officiated, and many accompanied the funeral procession to the cemetery in tribute to the young flier who lost his life in the crash of his airplane at Meridian, Miss., last week.

Several hundred persons were at the Milwaukee depot Sunday afternoon when the body arrived, escorted by Second Lieut. John Baldwin, of Will Rogers Field, Okla. Lieutenant Baldwin is one of the 46th Bomb group, 53rd Squadron, of which Flight Officer Giese was a member.

The body was escorted to the Baker funeral home by American Legionnaires and Sons of the American Legion. Two members of the SAL, of which Flight Officer Giese was a charter member, were among the active pall bearers. They are John Miller and Don Kester. Other pall bearers were Legionnaires A. J. Schmidt, J. J. Plzak, Gil S. Hein and Harold Wittenberg. Other members of the SAL squadron were honorary pall bearers.
