Men Seeks Term on mission

F. Zappen is a candidate for reelection to a second term on the city's Water and Light Commission. He led the nine aldermen of Anderson in a decision by mail to have mailed a copy of the City Clerk Ethel Gill for placement on the agenda for the next Tuesday council session. Zappen presented his term on the Water and Light Commission at the end of September. "I would like to be serving the community as commissioner on our own terms," he said. "I am now in the late stage of construction with present for operational completion. Discriminative Ruled on Ho

WASHINGTON (AP)—A federal court today ruled that a law discriminating against Chinese immigrants was unconstitutional. The court said the law violated the equal protection clause of the 14th Amendment. The law, known as the Chinese Exclusion Act, had been in effect since 1882. The court's decision was a landmark ruling in the history of immigration law.
