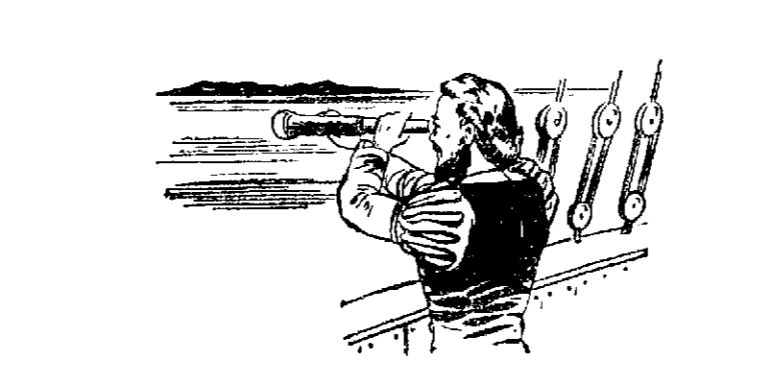

Petition Opposes Paving

Granted a petition by Washington street residents that the city refrain from paving the street between Twelfth and Sixteenth streets; authorized paving of Washington street between Fifteenth and Seventeenth streets next year and the coating of the street between Eighth and Twelfth streets.

Disallowed a petition of the Rev. A. W. Triggs that he be granted tax exemption on his property at 741 Dewey street. The city attorney ruled that the building, although used as a parsonage, is not tax exempt because it is not owned by the congregation served by the Rev. Mr. Triggs.
